General Rules, Categories & Judging Criteria for Exhibitors

- ◆ Exhibitor must be a Franklin County resident 18 years of age and older to enter exhibits
- ◆ Items must be completed in the last 12 months by the person whose name is on the entry.
- ◆ No name may be visible on the entry item itself.
- ◆ Only one item may be entered per class. Any item that fits into a listed class may not be put in another class.
- ◆ Entries must be left on display until 5:15PM on Sunday (no exceptions). Premiums will be given out at this time according to the following ribbons. Please make sure you or a designated person picks up entries by 5:30 latest. It has been a long week, thanks for your consideration.

Crafts

- ◆ Items should be displayed in clear plastic to protect from visitors and the weather.

- ◆ **Weaving:** two distinct sets of yarns or threads are interlaced at right angles to form a fabric or cloth.

Craft Judging Criteria

- ✓ Item appropriate for use in class entered (5 pts)
- ✓ Practical use of material (15pts)
- ✓ Creative use of color or design (15pts)
- ✓ Quality of assembly or handwork (20pts)
- ✓ Difficulty of construction (25pts)
- ✓ Appropriate for use or enjoyment (20pts)

Points are given in (). All classes are judged out of 100 points

Photography

- ◆ **Item must be framed**
- ◆ **Items should be displayed in clear plastic to protect from visitors and the weather.**

1. **People:** Portraits, Casual in a natural environment, or Environmental setting shown at work or play

Photography Judging Criteria

- ✓ Impact (gets an emotional reaction) (25pts)

<p>Food Food items must include the entire recipe and should be on non-returnable plates or dishes. Cover them with plastic wrap</p>

All classes are judged out of 100 points</p>

<p>Quilts</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ A Quilt is an item made with a padding between two layers of cloth, held together firmly by tying, hand, or machine stitching. ◆ Items should be displayed in clear plastic to protect from visitors and the weather.

Pieced, then professionally quilted (2 person) <p>Crib/Lap</p>	<p>Quilt Judging Criteria</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Overall quality: Is quilt square? One side not longer than the other. (10pts) ✓ Quality of seams: smooth and even, not coming apart. (10pts)

(20pts) ✓ Quality of blocks: uniform size (10pts) ✓ Quality of pressing: neatly pressed (10pts) ✓ Quality of quilting: Hand quilting is neat & even; machine quilting has good tension; tying is neat and no more than 6" apart (20pts) ✓ Quality of finishing: Bindings have quick turn; hand stitching is neat; binding is secure and even, batting fills the binding (20pts) <p>Points are given in ().
